

Bad Beat Jackpots



1. The Bad Beat Progressive Jackpot shall apply to the game of Texas Hold-em. To qualify for the Bad Beat, a hand of Aces Full of Jacks (A-A-A-J-J) or better must lose to a higher-ranking hand.
2. The Bad Beat Progressive Jackpot shall apply to the game of Seven Card Stud. To qualify for the Bad Beat, a hand of Aces Full of Jacks (A-A-A-J-J) or better must lose to a higher-ranking hand.
3. The Bad Beat Progressive Jackpot shall apply to the game of Omaha. To qualify for the Bad Beat, a hand of Four Deuces or better must lose to a higher-ranking hand.
4. Both winning and losing players must use both of their hole cards to create the highest possible hand. For four of a kind, both the winning and losing player's hand must contain a pocket pair. The minimum losing Bad Beat Hand will be Aces Full of Jacks and the losing player must have a pair of Aces in their hand; a hand higher than Aces Full of Jacks that gets beat is still eligible for the jackpot (e.g. 4 kings get beat by 4 aces).
5. A \$1.00 maximum amount will be removed from each pot that totals \$10.00 or more including the rake. In order for a hand to be eligible for the Bad Beat Payout, the pot must meet the \$10.00 minimum and there must be a minimum of five players dealt in. The hand must go to a showdown (played to the end, where all cards have been dealt and players have completed betting and show their cards to determine the winner) in order for the jackpot to be awarded.
6. Players must play their hands independently. If any player, whether directly or indirectly involved in the hand, passes information or instructs another on how to act or reveals their hand to other players, the Jackpot will be disqualified.
7. In order to collect any Bad Beat Progressive Jackpot payout, proper ID will be required. Payouts of the Bad Beat Progressive Jackpot are as follows:
 - a. 50% of the jackpot will be awarded to the Bad Beat hand (losing player);
 - b. 25% of the jackpot will be awarded to the winner of the hand;
 - c. 25% of the jackpot will be awarded equally divided among the balance of the seated players of the game who received cards at the beginning of the hand.
8. A player who removes his or her chips from the game prior to a showdown on a hand where a jackpot is won forfeits his or her right to any prize money:
 - a. If a player walks away from the game, but leaves chips on the table and he or she was in the hand at the beginning, they will retain their rights to their share of the jackpot if a jackpot hand occurs.
9. Players are eligible to win the posted Jackpot amount. Such amount will be updated once, at the same time, every gaming day.
10. All the cards must remain intact on the table until the Floor and Surveillance verifies the Bad Beat.
